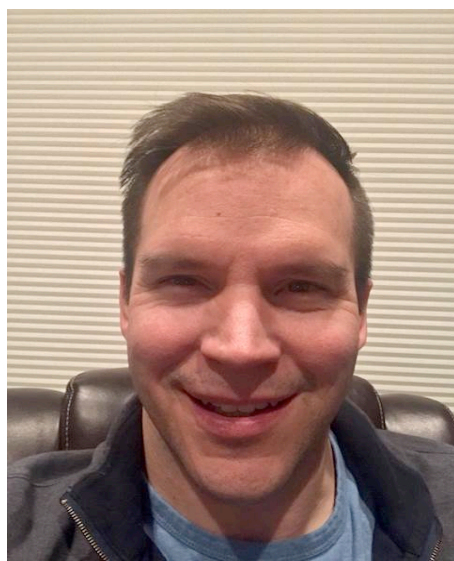


Our Graduates of 2009

After completing her Orthopaedic Residency, Andie completed a sports knee and shoulder arthroscopy fellowship at UBC under Dr. McCormack, and then trained in sports knee, and foot and ankle sports and lower extremity reconstruction under Dr. Amendola at the University of Iowa. During her second fellowship at the University of Iowa, she developed her skills for minimally invasive foot and ankle surgery as it pertains to foot and ankle reconstruction and joint preservation, and knee preservation techniques such as meniscal transplants, cartilage resurfacing, realignment, and patellofemoral stabilization.

Following fellowship, Andie had a community Orthopaedic practice in Nova Scotia, followed by a position at the University of Toronto as a surgeon scientist. In Toronto she moved her practice to high end foot and ankle sports and reconstruction, and continued to treat sports knee.

Currently, Andie is a sports knee and foot and ankle Orthopaedic Surgeon working at St. Paul's hospital under the University of British Columbia. She is interested in alignment restoration in complex knee and foot & ankle deformities, sports, and advanced arthroscopic reconstruction.

Her goal is joint preservation of the knee, foot and ankle through the use of cutting edge surgical techniques, realignment procedures, and biologic interventions.

Andie currently serves as the research director of the UBC Orthopaedic Program, and as the adult foot and ankle fellowship director. She was recently awarded the UBC teaching award, UBC McGraw honored lectureship, and has completed two prestigious travelling fellowships (CFBS and ASG). She currently maintains a sports knee and sports foot and ankle affiliation with UBC varsity sports teams.
