He then completed a Fellowship in Spinal Disorders and Orthopaedic Trauma at the University of Toronto in 1990.

Dr. Lewis returned to Newfoundland to begin his practice in Corner Brook in 1991. He is currently Chief of Orthopaedics at the Western Memorial Regional Hospital, specializing in trauma, spinal surgery, arthroplasty and sports medicine. He is a certified Fellow of the Royal College of Surgeons of Canada, the American College of Surgeons, the American Academy of Orthopaedic Surgeons and is a Diplomat of the American Board of Orthopaedic Surgery. He also holds a Diploma of Sports Medicine from the Canadian Academy of Sports Medicine.

Dr. Lewis was instrumental in introducing the Orthopaedic teaching unit at Western Memorial Hospital and is currently a clinical assistant professor of surgery at Memorial University. Dr. Lewis is also the co-author of the Whiplash and Back Injury Learning CD for physicians.
